Valerie always puts the needs of the resident first whether its explaining Dr. orders, illnesses, medications or diets. Her job is not always easy, it is never easy to explain to a family that, "It might be time we looked at Hospice" or "end of life is near and its time to call the other family members in". Valerie, is not only a mentor to the people who she works with, she is also an intrical part of our management team. Valerie has one of the most difficult jobs in our community but she does it with grace and dignity and enough faith in herself, that the residents, families, and others in the medical profession that she interacts with daily feel that their loved ones or patients could not be in better hands.
